After dinner guests were introduced.

Deane Motis then introduced our speaker Dave Stockert from the Seattle Seafarer's Center. The Mission to Seafarer organization was started in 1856 in the UK and provided support during the war for families. There are more than 200 centers worldwide.

The Seattle Seafarer's Center was created to help meet the needs of the seamen visiting the port of Seattle, mainly communication and transportation. They are a vital lifeline in ports to help provide rest and relaxation, transportation ship to shore and repatriation for those who are injured or are returning home. They also provide counselling and mediation in a crisis or day to day. Many of the workers are away from home for 9 months or more so communication from their port connections is essential, which is a great service that is provided. Many are not able to leave the ships due to lack of proper paperwork, so there are ship visitors that include Catholic, Lutheran, and Episcopal Deacons.

Over 2000 ditty bags are made and are given to the seafarers including a knitted stocking cap in each hand-sewn bag. These bags are known throughout the world to be the highest quality.

They have 35 volunteers here and they transport more than 16,000 seafarers from the Port to downtown in a year by van. Seattle Seafarer's Center is looking for more volunteers so if you are interested please contact them at office.mts.seattle@gmail.com or call 206-935-3439.
